Below outlines what is required to complete the entry forms. We suggest you collate your responses, then copy and paste into the entry form. The entry form can be saved and continued later using a provided link.

KEY NOMINEE AND NOMINATOR INFORMATION

- *The Interdisciplinary Collaboration Award is a team category, which must have:*

- *A minimum of two team members*
- *A Contractor representative*
- *One or more Consultants*
- *A designated Team Contact (can be one of the above).*

ABOUT THE PROJECT TEAM

A key determinant of how successful a construction project will be is the relationship between those commissioned to design, document, and deliver the resultant building. The Interdisciplinary Collaboration Award celebrates exceptional examples of collaborative partnerships between consultant(s) and contractor.

- In 500 words or less, tell us about the Project Team. The project team background may include details on any of the following:
 - Background on the team's formation for this project i.e. Design-build, procured as a team, or procured separately, etc.
 - Previous projects in which members of the team have worked together (if any)
 - Why each team member was chosen (by their company) for their role on this project
 - Roles of each team-member

- In 500 words or less, tell us how the team excelled in delivering the Project. The Project Team's role may cover those aspects listed below:
 - Design vision
 - Ingenuity
 - Use of technology across all of / part of the design, documentation, delivery stages of the project
 - Management style of the team
 - Planning
 - Quality of project
 - Detail on the communication channels and reporting procedures
 - Adherence to project timeline and handover date
 - Contractual
 - Workplace safety
 - Working relationships
 - Project difficulties and innovation

CHALLENGES

- In 500 words or less, tell us some of the challenges faced by the team during this Project. Challenges that the project team may have confronted might include:
 - Design
 - Planning (Resource Consenting)
 - Programme and coordination
 - Logistics
 - Resourcing
 - Client/Consultant relationships
 - Environmental/Market constraints or pressures
 - Budget
 - Other
